

# Many Follow Jesus

LUKE 5:1-11; 6:12-16; 8:1-3

This week's theme is **DISCIPLES**. Jesus called many different people to follow him. We're all called to be disciples who love, help, and serve others.

## Let's Worship Together

Disciples invite others to learn about Jesus. Use art supplies to create invitations to your church. Include the name and address of the church and worship times. Pass them out to people in your neighborhood.

## Everyone Is Called

Print pictures of family members, friends, and people in your church family. Glue them inside a cardstock footprint to create a collage. Display in your home to remember that we're all disciples.

## Following Jesus

Cut straws into various lengths and tape inside a shoebox lid to create a maze. Use a marble and pretend you are following Jesus down a long, winding road. Take turns tilting the lid, moving one marble at a time through the maze.

## Walking Together

Jesus and his followers walked from place to place teaching about God. Trail mix is a great snack for a long walk. Combine cereal, raisins, and chocolate chips. Walk with friends, talk about Jesus, and eat trail mix together.

## Dear Diary

Jesus called some fishermen to follow him. Imagine that you are fishing on a boat in the Sea of Galilee. Write a diary entry to tell about meeting Jesus and dropping your nets to follow him.

## You've Got Talent

Make a list of some people who share their talents at your church. Call a different person on your list each day to thank them for being disciples by sharing their talents with your church family.

1. Draw a square at the bottom of the space.
2. On the bottom line of the square, draw a small, vertical rectangle.
3. Inside one long edge of the rectangle, draw a small circle.
4. On the top line of the square, draw a triangle pointing upward.
5. On the right side of the triangle, draw a small vertical rectangle.
6. Above and not connected to the triangle, draw a small circle.
7. Around the circle, draw six straight lines. The lines can go in any direction.
8. Inside the square, draw a small square.
9. Next to that square, draw an identical square.
10. Under that square draw another identical square
11. Next to that square, draw another identical square.

1. In the middle of the space, draw a horizontal oval.
2. Connected to the right side of the oval, draw a circle.
3. On top of the circle, draw two small, triangles facing up, one a little to the right and one a little to the left.
4. In the middle of the circle, draw a small, upside-down triangle.
5. Above the upside-down triangle, draw two small circles, one a little to the right and one a little to the left.
6. Below the upside-down triangle, draw an arc that curves up.
7. Draw three straight lines that connect to the right side of the upside-down triangle.
8. Draw three straight lines that connect to the left side of the upside-down triangle.
9. Along the bottom of the oval, draw four vertical lines
10. At the bottom of each of those lines, draw a small circle.
11. Draw a wavy line connecting to the left side of the oval.
